Metaphor is a comparison between two things which are basically unrelated using one to describe the other.

Simile is a comparison between two things which are basically quite different without using like or as. While a simile says that one thing is like another, a metaphor says that something is another (and, metaphorical). Metaphors are used often in writing.

Personification is a kind of metaphor in which animals, plants, inanimate objects, or abstract ideas are represented as if they were human beings and possessed human qualities.

Symbol is something concrete (like a picture, object, image, or word) which has a meaning that is not literal. The word is the symbol for the meaning. The word symbolizes something abstract.

Simile is a comparison between two things which are basically quite different without using like or as. While a simile says that one thing is like another, a metaphor says that something is another (and, metaphorical). Metaphors are used often in writing.
