Shares when others need.	Generally takes care of school property; does not habitually damage others' belongings.	Often breaks pens, pencils, and leaves messes for others to clean up; sometimes meddles with others' belongings.	Regular tendency of damaging others' property or own belongings. Little remorse for actions when corrected.
