

SARCASM

: when someone says **THE OPPOSITE** to what they are really thinking.
You should **RESPOND** to what you guess the person is **THINKING**
— **NOT** to what they have **SAID**.

SARCASM should be used in a friendly, joking way, but some people use it to be rude or nasty.

...but one day, the wind messed his hair up.



He didn't know it, but his hair looked **VERY SILLY!**

Usually, Carl's hair looks like this...

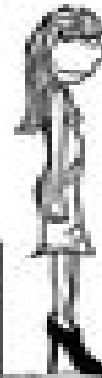


Your hair looks so **CRAZY!**

Hey, **NICE** hair!

Only **USE** sarcasm with people that you know well. Be careful using it with people older than you. They might think you are being rude.

Nicole is wearing her new high-heels.



I think you need some higher heels!

Whooo! Those heels are too high!

Mom laughs when she sees her son's face. He has food all over it.



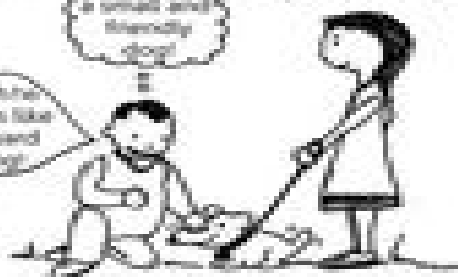
Your face is so **dirty!**
