We can understand what a word means by looking at its parts. (We can understand the meaning of a sentence by looking at the parts that make up the sentence.)

1. Finding words

- Words are made up of syllables and letters. [1] **BOOKS**
- When letters are connected, we get...

BOOKS = /bʊk/ + /s/ = /bʊk.s/

- Sometimes getting **BOOKS**

BOOKS = /bʊk.s/ = /bʊk/ + /s/ = /bʊk.s/

When we get **BOOKS**, we get the sound /bʊk.s/ which is the sound of the word **BOOKS**.
