- You cannot use more and -er with the same adjective.
  Incorrect: Bill is more taller than I am.
  Correct: Bill is taller than I am.

  Always use than after a comparative adjective: Bill is taller than his brother.
  Don't confuse than with then, which means at a later time.
  Follow spelling rules when adding endings.
