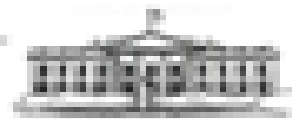

The Executive Branch



Directions: Learn about your Executive Branch.

The executive branch is the branch of government that makes laws official. The President is the head of the executive branch and is elected by the entire country. The President serves in office for a four-year term, and can be reelected for a second consecutive four-year term.

The President approves new laws passed by the legislative branch and sees that those laws are carried out. The President appoints, or removes, members of his cabinet. He also negotiates treaties and is the Commander-in-Chief of the U.S. armed forces.

Also part of the executive branch are the Vice President and members of the cabinet. The cabinet, which gives advice to the President about important happenings, is made up of those who head/flead/leed departments within the government.
