**A. How to make your introduction "attention getting"?**

**Tip 1:** Use language to create an impression

Use vivid and powerful words to create an impression. Use adjectives to make something more lively, more complete, more than it really is. Use present tenses to make it more dramatic and exciting.

**Example**

**Topic: "Whether or not school should be abolished"**
