Integrated schools:

- The 1954 Supreme Court Case of Brown v. BOE of Topcka, KS, outlawed segregated schools,
- In 1957, the Board of Education of Little Rock, Arkansas, attempted to comply with the Brown ruling by admitting nine black students to Central High School.
- These students became known as the Little Rock
 Nine.
- However, the governor of Arkansas, Orval Faubus, opposed integration.
- Governor Faubus called out the National Guard in order to prevent the Little Rock Nine from attending previously all-white Central High School.




