

**PROSPERITY, REBELLION, AND REFORM (1945 - 1980)**

**Objective:** To examine the circumstances surrounding the Little Rock Nine and the formation of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC).

**Integrated schools:**

- The 1954 Supreme Court Case of *Brown v. BOE of Topeka, KS*, outlawed segregated schools.
- In 1957, the Board of Education of Little Rock, Arkansas, attempted to comply with the Brown ruling by admitting nine black students to Central High School.
- These students became known as the Little Rock Nine.
- However, the governor of Arkansas, Orval Faibus, opposed integration.
- Governor Faibus called out the *National Guard* in order to prevent the Little Rock Nine from attending previously all-white Central High School.
- By refusing to enforce the Brown decision, Faibus was *violating* federal law.
