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Hand Washing Lesson Plan Kindergarten

Objective: Students will understand the importance of hand washing.
Objectives: Students will explain the importance of being in charge of their own health.

General Information:

- Germs are everywhere.
- Germs can make you sick.
- Germs can make you dirty.
- You can get rid of germs by washing your hands.

How to Wash Your Hands:

1. Wet hands, running water.
2. Use liquid soap or whatever position.
3. Rub hands together for at least 20 seconds.
4. Wash undermost the fingernails.
5. Rinse and dry dry.

Then to Wash Your Hands:

- Wet using the water.
- Liquid soap or powder soap.
- After playing with animals.

Finger Prints:

For a group activity that will also teach, turn a student's hand. Explain that the bacteria that live on hands reproduce much faster than other things that they touch and survive. Turn have the students touch an object for each, then touch each other. Ask them who happened to the细菌 that touched the objects. Explain that this is what happens when we touch other hands and then touch an object that gives us more bacteria on the object. Discuss what might happen if one of those objects touches the other child's hand after touching or touching in that the germs will be transferred and there will be lots of different germs to grow.

Handwashing Techniques:

- Hand washing message needs to be reinforced several times throughout the day. Especially before meals and after using the restroom.
- Wash by example.
- The teacher should emphasize with him the message the bottom of the page pertaining to wash their hands. You may want to pass one or all of the activity sheets in the classroom prior to use a number of the pledges.
