

Making jottings

When adding two larger numbers it is sometimes a good idea to jot down what you are doing, like this:



e.g. $78 + 46$



$$78 + 46 = 78 + 40 + 6 = 118 + 6 = 124$$

Try to fill the missing numbers in on these jottings:

1. $58 + 46 = 58 + \square + 6 = \square + 6 = 104$

2. $46 + 55 = 46 + \square + 5 = \square + 5 = 101$

3. $28 + 34 = 28 + \square + 4 = \square + 4 = 62$

4. $63 + 28 = 63 + \square + 8 = \square + 8 = 91$
