













Tints - Alternative Color Mixing Worksheet

NOTE: The traditional way to lighten color is with white, but what would happen if you used another color? What if lighter color instead? Let's try some examples.

Value
TINT - Lighter Value

Use paint or poster to mix the shapes with the appropriate color.

1. The blue shape with the white color.
2. On the top rectangles, choose a color that is lighter in value than the original color. On the bottom rectangle, write what color you chose. Mix it with the pure color.
3. On the side rectangles, choose a neutral color like gray or brown to add to your original color. You may need to add white to the neutral color to make sure it is lighter than your original color. On the blank below, write what color you chose to mix with the pure color.
