

Word Study Activities for Choice Night

Words marked with ** require a parent signature in the word study notebook in order to receive credit!

- Alphabetize your words
- Divide each word into syllables
- Write each word neatly in PEN 5 times
- Write and neatly frame each word
- Make a set of flash cards for studying your words**
- Type the words three times each on a computer. print. glue into notebook.
- Use the “pattern words” in a sentence and underline the spelling word.
- Write the words and a synonym or antonym for each word
- Scramble the words for make fill-in-the-blank sentences
- Draw a picture and “hide” the words in the picture
- Write newspaper headlines using the words.
- Cut words (or letters to make the words) out of a magazine/newspaper and glue in your notebook.
- Record words on a cassette tape and practice with a tape recorder.**
- Make a word search using the words.
- Calculate the value of each word. A=1, B=2, C=3, etc.
- Write the words in code. Provide a key for your code.
- Write tongue twisters with the words.
- Use the words in similes. Underline each spelling word. (Ex. He was as quiet as a mouse. She sang like a mockingbird.)
- Write a poem using your words. Underline each spelling word.
- Make a crossword puzzle on graph paper using the words. Glue into notebook.
- Write a definition for each word.
- Write a story using the words. Underline each word.
- Write couplets using the words. (Ex. He was fast in the past.)
- Create a variety of book titles using your words. Sketch out the covers of three.
- Write your spelling words in chalk, or use a paintbrush and water to practice your spelling words on the sidewalk outside. (Check with a parent first!)**
- Be creative! Make up another way to practice your spelling words!**
