What do I bring to class?

You should have the following supplies with you in class everyday.

- 1) **Binder with five dividers, loose-leaf paper and graph paper**
(This binder should be used for math only. We will label the dividers as a class.)
- 2) **Pencils (at least two)**
- 3) **Red or Hot Pink Pen**
- 4) **Scientific Calculator**
The district recommended calculator for all classes through geometry is the Texas Instruments TI-30XIIS.

Calculators will not be allowed on all assignments; however, you should have a calculator available.

Textbooks will be used in class, but will not be checked out to students at this time.

When can I use my calculator?

We will let you know when it is okay to use your calculator. Please ask if you're not sure.
