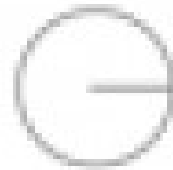


To find the **area** of a circle, multiply π by the radius squared.
 What is π ? π , or π , is 3.1415926535... , but we will call it 3.14.
 The **Radius** of the circle is the measurement of any line segment that starts at the center of the circle and extends outward to the circle.
 The **Diameter** is twice the Radius.
