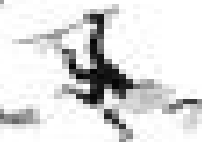
We use Have/Has got to:

- Express possession: I **HAVE GOT** a new car - Lily **HAS GOT** a big house
- Describe people/animals: The lion **HAS GOT** brown hair - Lukas and Lisa **HAVE GOT** blue eyes.

Affirmative Sentences

Single Examples:

He
She
It } **HAS GOT**



E.g. It **has got** a long tail.

Group Examples:

They
You
We
I } **HAVE GOT**



E.g. You **have got** a big hat.

Negative Sentences

Single Examples:

He
She
It } **HASN'T GOT**
HAS NOT GOT



E.g. She **hasn't got** long hair.

Group Examples:

They
You
We
I } **HAVEN'T GOT**
HAVE NOT GOT



E.g. They **haven't got** a phone.

Questions

Single Examples:

Q: He **has got** "long hair" ?
It

A: Yes, she **HAS**
No, it **HASN'T**

Group Examples:

Q: They **have got** "a big hat" ?
We
I

A: Yes, they **HAVE**
No, I **HAVEN'T**
