• Positive and negative sentences:

HAVE GOT

I – YOU – WE – THEY

HAS GOT

HE – SHE – IT

HAVEN'T GOT

HASN'T GOT

• I have got long hair.
• You have got brown eyes.
• They have got black hair.
• We haven't got a car.

• He has got glasses.
• She hasn't got a car.
• It has got short hair.
• He hasn't got any eyes.

• Questions (Q) and answers:

HAVE they **GOT** brown eyes?

Yes, they have.
No, they haven't.

HAS she **GOT** dark skin?

Yes, she has.
No, she hasn't.
