

SOUND KEY:

[do not teach key words to students]

shut - push
 nation - friendship
 'sh' -

TEACHER SHOWS CARD AND SAYS:

used at the beginning of a word, at the end of a syllable, but *not* at the beginning of most syllables after the first one, except for the ending 'ship'

TEACHER WRITES: sh [and says]

"Say with me,

STUDENTS SAY: [with teacher]

'sh' -

used at the beginning of a word, at the end of a syllable, but *not* at the beginning of most syllables after the first one, except for the ending 'ship'."

STUDENTS WRITE: sh

Note: When *testing* this one, do not say "*except for the ending 'ship'.*" When **s** and **h** are combined in the same syllable, they form a completely new sound called a consonant digraph. There are a few additional uses of /sh/ which this phonogram's designation does not include [*marshall, fashion, cushion, grasshopper*]. If you are teaching older students, you may need to share this information immediately. **Stop, mix and test.**
