part of speech	function or job?	example words	example sentence
Noun	named a thing	cat, dog, book, do, like, work, ring, cat, dog	English/She likes to work with I like English/mathematics
Verb	thing of person	run, stop, work, know, show, finish, finish, like	She is studying. We have never before. We live in London.
Adjective	describes a noun	she, the, all, some, good, big, red, well, interesting	My dog is big. I like my dog.
Adverb	describes a verb, adjective or object	quickly, slowly, well, badly, very, really	My dog runs quickly. She talks very quickly.
Pronoun	replace a noun	I, you, he, she, him	There is a book. She is beautiful.
Preposition	links a noun to another word	in, on, after, on, for	We went to school on Monday.
Conjunction	join two or more words	and, but, or	I like dogs and cats. I like dogs but I don't like cats.
Interjection	short exclamations, sometimes standing alone sentences	oh, wow, yes, well	Good! That's great! Oh! There are just that, I don't know.

- Words may be grouped into different parts of speech
 - i. **Primary Words** (noun, verb, noun)
 - ii. **Secondary Words** (pre, post, conj)
