Goals & Objectives

Cognitions (Cognitive goals) Assuming effort on the part of the student, the student will:

1. comprehend the Spanish language spoken at a normal tempo using the basic expressions, vocabulary and verb structures covered in class (also to include written Spanish).
2. increase vocabulary.
3. have a working knowledge of intermediate grammar so as to use it orally and in written communication.
4. learn and know facts about those countries, cultures and people where Spanish is spoken.

Cognitive skills Assuming effort on the part of the student, the student will be able to:

1. speak Spanish intelligibly using the basic patterns of speech at his command.
2. read Spanish with general understanding without literal translation.
3. write in Spanish with clarity and reasonable correctness using the vocabulary and grammar structures at his command.

Affects Assuming effort on the part of the student, the student will:

1. develop an awareness and understanding of foreign cultures.
2. develop an awareness and understanding of his own culture.
3. develop an interest in the need for global awareness, understanding and communication.

Psychomotor-perceptual skills (Phonetic skills) Assuming effort on the part of the student, the student will be able to:

1. pronounce words correctly.
2. speak Spanish with accurate inflection.
3. pay special attention to phonetic nuances of Spanish such as the LL, RR and Ñ as well as cultural pronunciation differences.

Requirements and Assessments for Spanish 3

I. Requirements:

Homework (HW): There will be a written homework assignment almost daily. A student is expected to review the vocabulary and material **EVERY NIGHT** regardless of whether there is a written assignment. This daily dedication is essential to expand one's proficiency in a foreign language. Generally, points will be awarded for completion. Occasionally, HW will be collected and graded for grammar; also occasionally, HW will not be graded.

Late homework will NOT be accepted (unless with an excused absence)! An assignment is considered late if it is not complete when checked or collected. It is the responsibility of the student to remember to turn in the assignment. HW is expected to be completed the day after being assigned. The student may be given more time to complete longer written assignments.

Homework must be legible. If homework is not legible, it will not be accepted. Assignments must be completed in pencil, blue or black ink, or typed. Assignments completed in red ink or other colors will not be graded.
