

SOME OF AMERICA'S MOST INFLUENTIAL AND FAMOUS IMMIGRANTS

The immigration波es of the late 1800s and early 1900s gave us some of the most influential Americans. See if you can match these eight famous immigrants with their accomplishments.

FACT: Many laws sometimes changed at immigration customs due to transportation issues, or immigrants changed their last names according to American Law. Look for clues in the descriptions to match with the names on the left.



1. Isaac Asimov

A. Born in Russia, he was processed at Ellis Island under the name David Bialik in 1919. He wrote thousands of the most famous American songs.

2. Albert Einstein

B. Astronomist Alexander Tamm arrived in 1895 from England. One of the most well-known scientists in history, he won Nobel for his great body and many theories.

3. John Muir

C. Originally named Krik Weiss, this famous magazine owner with his family came Hungary in 1882.

4. Joseph Pulitzer

D. He arrived in 1854 from Russia as Jacob Weiszchitz. Often called the man who wrote some of the most famous science-fiction stories in history.

5. Harry Houdini

E. He came from Scotland in 1882. He went on to study anatomy and became a human osteopathologist. The founder of The Matrix Club, he's often considered the father of the modern-day entrepreneurial movement.

6. Cary Grant

F. He arrived in Boston from Hungary in 1884 under the name Palorus Klosz. He became a famous journalist. Every year, awards named after him are given out to screen, photography, and artists.

7. Irving Berlin

G. This man, born in Maligrad, Poland, came through Ellis Island from Poland. He was a Hollywood make-up artist who created one of the most famous cinematic sequences in history.

8. Max Factor

H. A German scientist, he moved to the United States in the 1930s. As a Jewish man, he decided to leave Europe because the Nazis were making it unsafe for Jews to continue living there.
