Adverbial conjunctions

1. Adverbial clause - a clause which refers to a thing which depends upon an established fact (time, position or degree)
 - 'Because', 'because' and 'since' are adverbial clauses.
2. Relative clause - a clause which gives more information about a noun or pronoun, usually in a subordinate position
 - As for example: my paper, my teacher.

2) Prepositions and Phrases

1. A prepositional phrase is the phrase which gives the idea of position, time, direction, etc.
2. A phrasal prepositional clause is a prepositional phrase which is a clause.
