

Compound Sentences

A compound sentence is made up of two or more complete sentences.
(complete = independent = having both a subject and verb.)

John wanted to go, but the teacher would not let him. **John wanted to go, but he didn't get to go.**

Under each verb complete sentences in the first box by combining a complete main clause & verb with that clause in one connecting word with a complete main clause & verb with that verb.

John went to the carnival.
John wanted to ride the roller coaster.
John played arcade games.
John tried to win a stuffed bear.
John started to get therapy.

She had a great time.
She rode on all the rides.
She didn't have enough money.
She didn't buy the bag.
She stood in a long line.
I started to eat.
They went to Europe last year.
She bought a new dress.

Example: **John went to the carnival, but she didn't enjoy the trip.**
