Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1791)

Mozart was born in Salzburg, Austria, on January 27, 1756. Mozart's father, Leopold, was a musician and a music teacher. Wolfgang was a child prodigy at the age of five; he composed a minuet, and played both the harpsichord and the violin. He performed for the Habsburg Royal court with his father and sister when he was six years old. Between the ages of 7 and 18, Wolfgang and his older sister toured Europe, playing for Kings, emperors, and other royalty. Mozart wrote his first symphony at nine years old.

During his short but very productive life, Mozart wrote over 600 pieces, including symphonies, sonatas, concertos, operas, dance music, and masses. Some of his most famous pieces are Eine Kleine Nachtmusik, K259, the opera La Clemenza di Tito, K620 and die Zauberflöte (The Magic Flute, K623), the "Linz" Symphony No. 31 in C Major, K298, and his Requiem Mass, K626.

Mozart married Constanze Weber in Vienna in 1782; they had six children but only two survived to become adults. Mozart's popularity with the public went up and down, and he had continuous financial problems, often because of his own bad habits. He was known to be rude and talk rudeness, and treat it like it, often obnoxious, though some nobility seeing his talents.

Mozart was only 35 years old when he died on December 5, 1791 in Vienna, Austria. He had been ill for some time, often with rheumatic fever. Most historians believe he died of rheumatism from eating raw pork. Because he was penniless when he died, Mozart was buried in a pauper's (poor) grave in Vienna, Austria.
