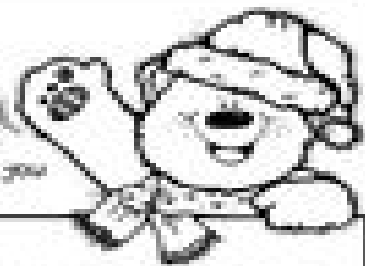

2. John threw 6 snowballs, Peg threw 4 snowballs and Dan threw 3 snowballs. Everyone made a snowman. How many snowballs did the children throw?

3. Tim caught 5 fish, Jane caught 10 fish and Betty caught 3 fish. They saw 5 birds while they were fishing. How many fish did they catch?

4. Sally had a cookie jar with 6 chocolate chip cookies, 5 sugar cookies and 2 oatmeal cookies. There was a candy cane in the jar. How many cookies were in the jar?

5. Timmy read books at the library. He read 2 books about dogs, 7 books about dinosaurs and 3 books about Egypt. He went home at 2:00. How many books did Timmy read?

6. Amy has 3 pencils in her backpack. She also has 5 red crayons, 4 yellow crayons and 6 blue crayons. How many crayons does Amy have in her backpack?

7. Mom has 4 red hats, 4 pink hats and 6 green hats. Mom has a blue scarf. How many hats does mom have altogether?

8. The squirrel ate 3 acorns on Monday, 9 acorns on Tuesday and 5 acorns on Wednesday. He ate 2 apples on Thursday. How many acorns did the squirrel eat altogether?

10. Tom ate 3 pieces of pizza, Sally ate 4 pieces of pizza and Nick ate 10 pieces of pizza. They each had 2 sodas. How many pieces of pizza did the children eat in all?
