Active or Linking Verbs Worksheet

An active verb is a verb that names an action. It may contain more than one word. It may contain a helping verb (be, do, jump, sit etc...). A linking verb connects the subject over with a noun or adjective in the predicate part. (be, am, are, is, were, seems etc...).
