

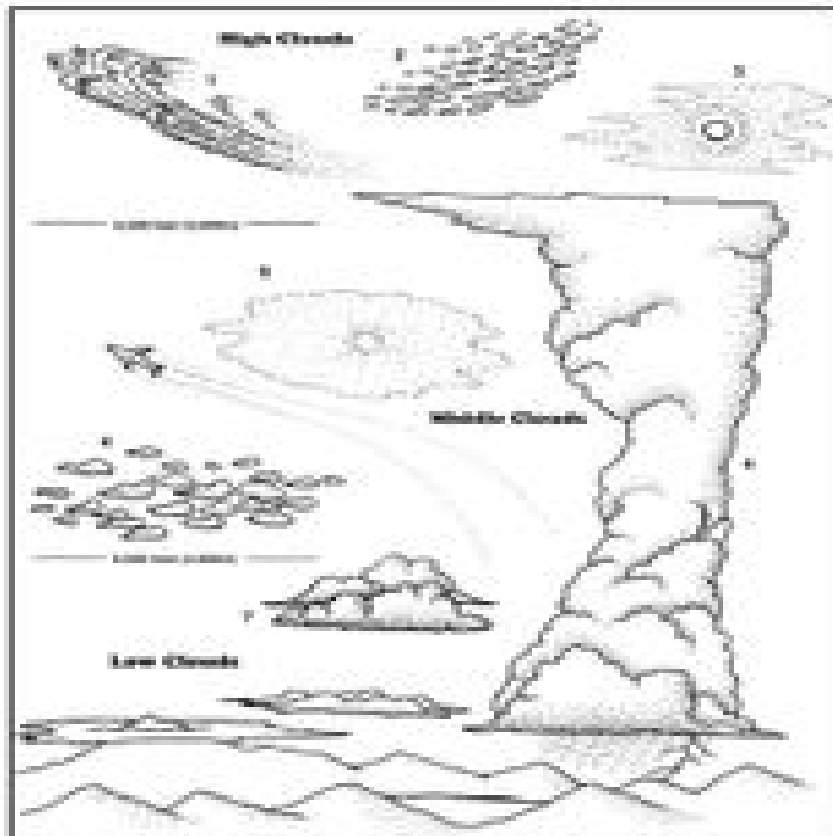
Clouds Facts and Fun

Altostratus are high clouds that are thin and grey. They cover the sky allowing only pale patches of the sun and no shadows on the ground. They also are good at being a sign of an incoming storm or rain later.

Cumulonimbus are thunderheads with low tops but towers that can go quite tall. They have dark tops with lightning and sometimes even have rain.

Cumulus are the classic high clouds that spread across the sky looking like fluffy dice. They have a top around the sun, but enough light to make shadows on the ground.

Cumulus are common for weather clouds that are fluffy and they are in a blue sky. They have dark but broken and rounded, fluffy tops. They are low-level clouds.

Cumulus are small, rounded puff of clouds that appear across the sky in sun. They are white. They're also that are called a weather die.

Cirrus are the most common high clouds. They are very high, wispy clouds that are the white-on-blue type. They are called "feather" clouds. They are a sign of good weather conditions.

Altostratus are high puff clouds that spread across the sky with a grey cover. On the horizon line, they form shadows from the sun.
