

Purpose: To develop social awareness and critical thinking skills, practice active reading, and write argumentatively based on topics in the news.

Procedure for Presenters:

- With your partner/group, select a topic that is current and can be "argued" (the topic must have more than one opinion/position).
- Read and compare two articles from different sources/of different types, considering their individual perspectives on the topic.
- Collect outside research on the topic (background, supporting information, etc.) from at least **one** 3. additional source.
- Prepare a 10-15 minute lesson to present to the class (Powerpoint, Slideshow, etc). You will turn in:
 - a. Lesson plan

 - b. MLA bibliography of sourcesc. Two analysis questions based on your presentation.
- Present your lesson to the class.
- After the presentation, develop a purposeful activity to involve the audience. Students should interact with the presented information and think critically about the current event.
