

## Prepositions Can Show Positions in Time



A preposition connects a noun or pronoun to another word in the sentence, showing the relationship between them. Prepositions usually answer the questions *where?* or *when?*, telling about a person or object's location in either time or space.

Each of the questions below contains at least one prepositional phrase that connects a noun or pronoun to its position in time. Underline the prepositional phrases, then circle the preposition. The first one is done for you.
