

## Degrees of Comparison of Adjectives

Positive	Comparative	Superlative
big	bigger	the biggest
strong	stronger	the strongest
slow	slower	the slowest
short	shorter	the shortest
young	younger	the youngest
heavy	heavier	the heaviest
wide	wider	the widest

### Irregular Comparative Forms

Positive	Comparative	Superlative
good	better	the best
bad	worse	the worst
far	farther	the farthest (distance)
far	further	the furthest (non-distance)
well	better	the best (with adjectives)
badly	worse	the worst (with adjectives)
little	less	the least (with adjectives)
few	fewer	the fewest (with nouns)
many	more	the most (with nouns)
much	more	the most (with nouns)

The degree of a verb is formed with prefixes.

The prefixes used to form infinitives are:

to go → to **go** → to go → to go

to see → to **see** → to see → to see

to know → to **know** → to know → to know

to do → to **do** → to do → to do

to be → to **be** → to be → to be

The object of infinitives is a noun.
