6. _____ affect the central nervous system and alter normal functioning of the brain, resulting in mental or behavioral changes.
7. _____ speed up the central nervous system and cause increased heart and respiratory rates, high blood pressure, dilated pupils, and decreased appetite. Can also cause excessive sweating, headaches, blurred vision, dizziness, and sleeplessness.
8. _____ form of cocaine that can be smoked. Can be processed in lumps or rocks and freebasing it can involve using dangerous solvents that can result in injury or death from an explosion or fire.
9. _____ Can result in mood changes, more than normal sleep, or even a coma.
10. _____, sedatives, are drugs that tend to slow down the central nervous system. They relax muscles, relieve feelings of tension and worry, and bring on sleep.
