

THIRD GRADE BOOK REPORT

Choose a chapter book. It must have several characters in the story. You will choose two of the main characters. On one 3 by 5 card you will write the title and author.

Next, think of the character traits that your character shows in the book. Below are listed some examples of character traits. Choose two character traits for each of the two characters. Place the name of one character and the two traits you have chosen on a 3 by 5 card.

Ex. brave, helpful, considerate, smart, kind

Now, think of two examples of what the character did in the story that proves to us that the character had that trait. For example:

Card 1 Title and author

Card 2 Nate the Great's Character Traits

1. Persistent or never gives up
2. Intelligent or smart

Card 4 Persistent:

Proof: Nate had to look in a lot of places before he found Duncan's joke book. He looked in Duncan's freezer, the pancake house, and Booksie's Bookstore before they located the book. It took several hours to find the book.

Proof: Duncan kept thinking that they would never find the book in time. He thought the world would come to an end. This did not stop or discourage Nate. He kept looking.

Card 5 Intelligent:

Write two proofs.

Repeat Card 2-5 for the other main character.

Parents: At home please help your child prepare the hanger for the mobile. If you use an old fashioned wire hanger it will have a paper covering in the shape of a triangle. Help your child decorate this paper with the title and author of the book. You may wish to cover the paper with a decorative paper. If you do not have an old fashioned hanger you will have to help your child cover a plastic hanger with paper in the shape of a triangle. At school, the children will finish the mobile. If you have yarn scraps, material scraps that our class or your child can use to decorate a character send it in, please. Bring the cards and neatly covered hangers to school on November 5th.
