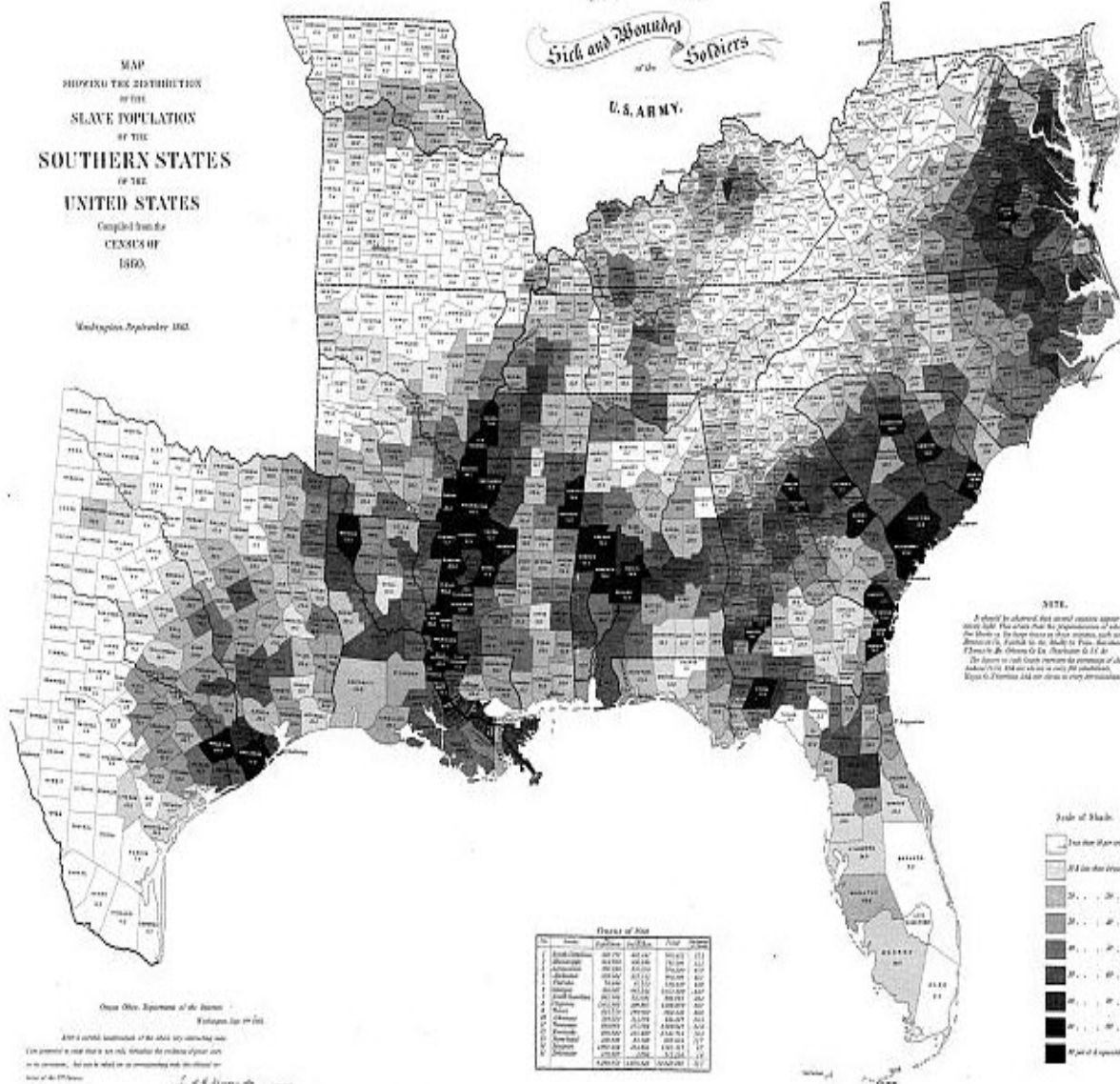


MAP

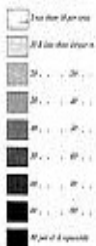

NOTE.

It should be observed that several counties appear unshaded, which is due to the fact that the population of slaves and the colored population in these counties is less than 100. The shaded counties are those in which the population of slaves is 100 or more.
