

<p>1st Amendment</p>	<p>freedom of speech, religion, the press, assembly, and petition</p>	<p>A group of people gather over 100 signatures in support of a law to present to their local representative.</p>
<p>2nd Amendment</p>	<p>the right to bear arms</p>	<p>Simon's grandfather owns several guns and is allowed to have them in his home.</p>
<p>3rd Amendment</p>	<p>the right to refuse to quarter, or house, soldiers</p>	<p>A soldier comes to your house and demands that you allow him to stay.</p>
<p>4th Amendment</p>	<p>protects citizens from unreasonable search or seizure by the government and its officials</p>	<p>A police officer pulls your dad's car over and demands to look through the vehicle without cause.</p>
<p>5th Amendment</p>	<p>protects people from being held for a crime unless officially accused, double-jeopardy, & self-incrimination</p>	<p>After being found not guilty, Sally cannot be tried again for the same crime.</p>
