Day 10: Grammar - Subject and Predicate Naming Book

Read the following carefully before you begin.

The **subject** of a sentence is what it's about (the person or thing).

The **predicate** tells something about the subject.

In this sentence,

The **child** of candy walked in the hot sun.

The **subject** is the **child** of candy.

The **predicate** is walked in the hot sun.

The **single subject** of a sentence is the main word in the subject. It is either a noun or a pronoun.

For example, in the subject **the child of candy**, the most important word is **child**.

The **single predicate** of a sentence is the main word in the predicate. It is a verb.

For example, in the predicate **walked in the hot sun**, the most important word is **walked**.
