

WRITING LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

One of the reasons that our community helps us become a better community is the newspaper and its great opinions. You can help support it by writing letters and articles on an issue. Letters are edited by the newspaper but published and distributed freely and they are given priority on most of the issues.

You can write your own letters to describe your issue and how you have done it. You can write one letter or more and we will accept them when you submit at least two arguments that explain your issue or your opinion, as well as a clearly stated plan for an ongoing argument and explain why you have done it. Letters should be written in a "strong" format.

The structure of your letter should be as follows:

1. **Opening**
2. **Context** (use your own words to describe the issue and how you have done it)
3. **Argument one** (or all the arguments supported by facts and statistics)
4. **Argument two** (or all the arguments supported by facts and statistics)
5. **Argument three** (or all the arguments supported by facts and statistics) (This is where you should use your own words to describe your issue and how you have done it)
6. **Close and thank**

You must also write comments by writing a paragraph (included in legal concepts section and included in the newspaper) that explains why you have done it.
