# SVO

In English, there are many ways to put up a sentence. One way to "formula" is with the SVO pattern.

In an SVO sentence, the \_\_\_\_\_ goes first, the \_\_\_\_\_ goes second, and the \_\_\_\_\_ goes last.

The **S** stands for \_\_\_\_\_. We know that a \_\_\_\_\_

- is the person or thing the sentence is about.

Ex: The students talked to the teacher.

"Students" is the subject because they are doing the verb "talked".

The **V** stands for \_\_\_\_\_. This is the action or \_\_\_\_\_ in a sentence that the subject is doing or experiencing.

Ex: The students talked to the teacher.

"talked" is the verb because it is the action that the subject is doing.

---

The **O** stands for \_\_\_\_\_. We know that an \_\_\_\_\_

- is the receiver of action within a sentence.
- is usually at the \_\_\_\_\_ of the sentence.
- answers the question \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_\_ is the action happening.

Ex: The students talked to the teacher.

"teacher" is the object because it is "to whom" the subject (students) the verb (talked)
