

Codominance Worksheet (Blood types)

Human blood types are determined by genes that follow the CODOMINANCE pattern of inheritance. There are two dominant alleles (I^A and I^B) and one recessive allele (i).

AB	$I^A I^B$	O, AB	A, B, AB and O (universal receiver)
