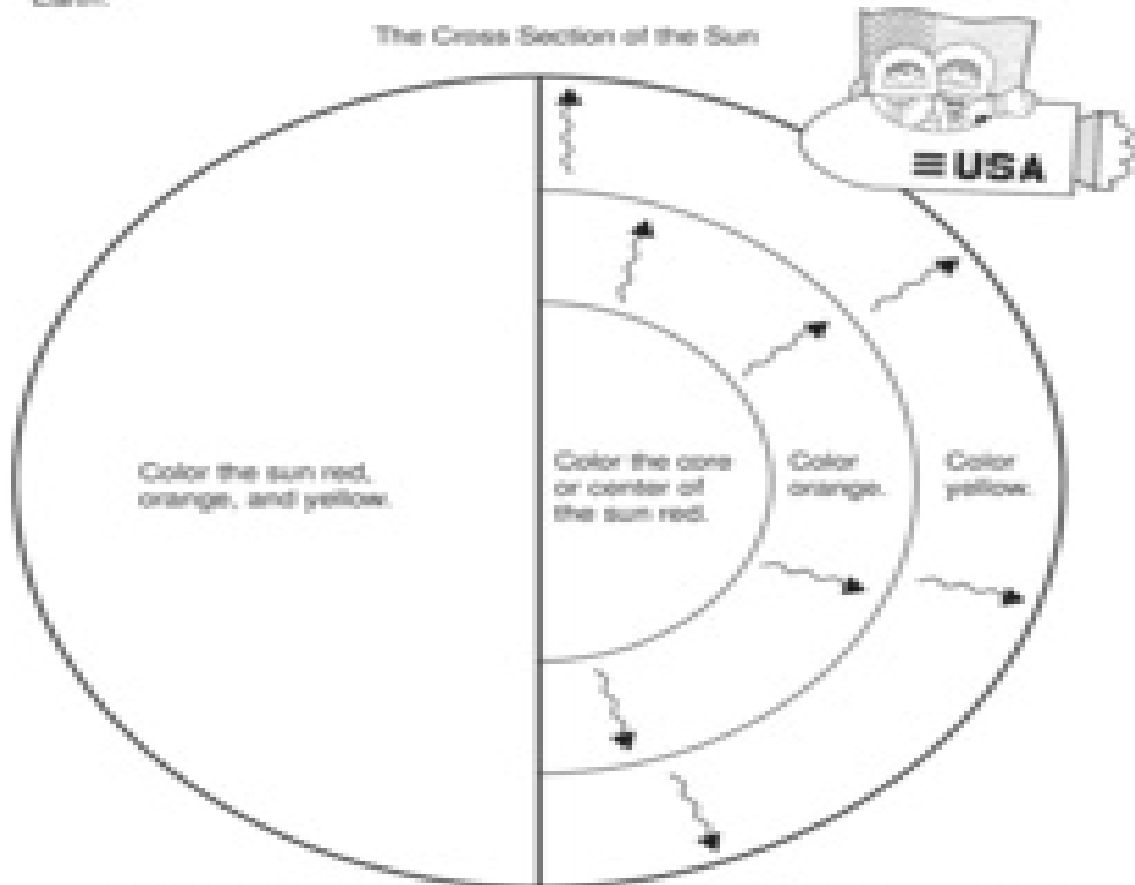


Our Closest Star—The Sun

Our sun is really a star. It is Earth's closest star. But it is a long way away. It is 93 million miles away. This distance does not keep us from feeling the heat of the sun on a warm day. The heat and light comes from hot, changing gases in the sun's center. This heat and light move from the sun. They travel through space to the Earth.
