- Throw out tired, old production methods
- Think of ways to make it work and not why it won't
- Deal with current conditions; don't make excuses
- 4. Don't expect perfection; 50-percent is fine at the beginning
- 5. Correct mistakes immediately
- 6. Don't spend a lot of money on improvements
- 7. Wisdom grows out of difficulties
- Ask "why?" at least five times until you find the real cause
- Better the wisdom of ten people that the knowledge of one
- 10. Improvements are unlimited
