1. Africans became suppliers of raw materials and consumers.
2. This was to establish national prestige through military conquest.
3. Colonial officers decided on their domain's extent of territory.
4. This was to convert Africa's (colonizers) to absolute slavery in Africa and bring Western education, medicine, hygiene, and managerial methods.
5. They were missionaries, teachers and more.

There was no need because the Latin American governments provided the political backing for the economic arrangements; the Latin Americans had shown themselves capable of resisting outsiders, most recently when Mexico fought off the French in the 1860s, and the United States itself a former colony, claimed to defend the entire Western Hemisphere against all outside intervention.
