It normally precedes the use of things or the words animal, object, plant and inanimate and have "the" or "an" in front of it (e.g. a cat, an elephant, a book, a sheep).</p>	<p>Things that have a clear individual identity. They are used as a kind of the name of more than one words (e.g. that the non-specific words like "a" or "an" do not precede them (e.g. Jesus Christ and the Philippines).</p>
