J. Born in Russia, he was processed at Ellis Island under the name Israel Belin in 1898. His name was one of the most famous American surnames.

K. Archibald Alexander Leitch arrived in 1829 from England. One of the most well-known names in Midwestern, he was known for his grid books and water flows.

L. Originally named Erik Weiss, this famous musician came with his family from Hungary in 1878.

M. He arrived in 1829 from Russia as Isak Voldemar Oksanen. He went on to write some of the most famous science-fiction stories in history.

N. He came from Scotland in 1891. He went on to study nature and became a famous conservationist.

The founder of The Sierra Club, he's often credited the father of the modern-day environmental movement.

P. He arrived in Boston from Hungary in 1884 under the name Pulitzer Mendel. He became a famous journalist. Every year, awards named after him are given out to writers, photographers and artists.

Q. This man, born Makymilian Filipowicz, came through Ellis Island from Poland. He was a Hollywood make-up artist who started one of the most famous cosmetics companies in history.

R. A famous scientist, he moved to the United States in the 1930s. As a Jewish man, he decided to leave Europe because the Nazis were making it unsafe for Jewish citizens to live there.
