

1st Amendment	freedom of speech, religion, the press, assembly, and petition	A group of people gather over 100 signatures in support of a law to present to their local representative.
2nd Amendment	the right to bear arms	Simon's grandfather owns several guns and is allowed to have them in his home.
3rd Amendment	the right to refuse to quarter, or house, soldiers	A soldier comes to your house and demands that you allow him to stay.
4th Amendment	protects citizens from unreasonable search or seizure by the government and its officials	A police officer pulls your dad's car over and demands to look through the vehicle without cause.
5th Amendment	protects people from being held for a crime unless officially accused, double-jeopardy, & self-incrimination	After being found not guilty, Sally cannot be tried again for the same crime.
