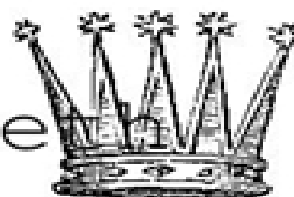

Read the facts about Queen Elizabeth again, then read the information below before answering questions 2 to 6...

Queen Elizabeth is not only the Queen of the United Kingdom, but is Queen of many other countries, including Jamaica and Barbados. She is the eldest daughter of Prince Albert, Duke of York and his wife Elizabeth, who was also known as 'The Queen Mother'. Queen Elizabeth had only one sister, Princess Margaret, who was four years younger than her. They were both home schooled at their private home. When Queen Elizabeth married her husband Prince Philip, they received over 2500 gifts from around the world. The Royal family attract millions of tourists to Britain each year, as do many of their celebratory events including Weddings and Christenings. Following Elizabeth and Philip's marriage, they made home at Buckingham palace before having three sons, Prince Charles, Prince Andrew and Prince Edward. Queen Elizabeth only had one daughter, Princess Anne. The Queen was crowned in 1953, and her coronation was the first to be televised. As Prince Charles is Elizabeth's eldest child, he is next in line to the throne, and after him will be his Son, William. Every year, Queen Elizabeth gives an annual Christmas message live on television, where the nation tunes in to see it, this is a British tradition. Elizabeth has reigned for 60 years in 2012, that's three years less than Queen Victoria.
