Plot

Describe 3 main events that are important to the story. What is the turning point in your opinion? Use evidence from the text to support your answer.

Cause & Effect

Using specific evidence from the text, describe 2 cause-effect relationships from the story.

Point of View

Who was telling the story? What evidence from the text supports your answer? How would the story have changed if it was told from a different character's point of view?

Postcard Summary

Write a postcard letter to a friend convincing them to read the book. Write a brief summary, and hook the reader with a specific example from the text.

Vocabulary

Pick 4 vocabulary words that either you don't know the meaning of or are important to understanding the text. Complete a Frayer Model card for each word.

Character Motive

Describe a problem faced by the main character using specific evidence from the text. What is the character's perspective or motive for taking action? How would you have solved the problem if you were in the main character's shoes? Why?

Setting

Using specific evidence from the text, describe in depth the setting of the story where most of the events take place. How would the story change if it took place in your city?

Theme

In your opinion, what is the theme of the story, or message the author is trying to convey. Use 3 pieces of evidence from the text to support your opinion.

Part Two

The author is writing a sequel to this story and has asked you for suggestions. Write a summary of the plot, characters, and setting for an engaging part two.
