## Reading Response Journal: RRJ

## Instructions:

- During Independent Reading, you will either be reading your book of choice, or writing a letter to me in your RRJ. You may choose to write directly in the notebook given to you, or you may want to glue one in.
- You must work on your Independent Reading at least once a day and you will be expected to complete at least ONE thoughtful response per week that is minimum one page long.
- 3. You may choose to write the letter all at once, or add to it over the course of the week.
- You may choose to write the letter DURING READING or AFTER READING your book
- Most of the time you will be reading and letters are NOT TO BE DONE AS HOMEWORK.
- 6. Your letters must not only be retelling what you have read. You will receive a list of possible topics to write about, whether you are reading fiction or non-fiction.
- 7. Depending on your student number, you will be expected to choose your best letter to be handed in for assessment at the end of the each week.

- 10. Your letters will be assessed using a rubric that will be attached to your notebook.
