**For each of the following court cases, fill in the required information. For the case background and the impact/precedent, please write a full paragraph. You should write so that someone could pick up your paper and learn from it. The first one is done for you.**

1. Bethel School District #403 v. Fraser
  - a. Date: July 7, 1986
  - b. People involved: Frasier, a high schools student; Bethel School District
  - c. Background of case: Frasier gave an inappropriate speech at a school assembly after being warned repeatedly not to give the speech. Frasier was suspended and filed suit against the school. An appellate court overturned his suspension, but the Supreme Court stated that a school had the right to limit the behavior of students if that behavior is vulgar or disruptive to learning
  - d. Impact/Precedent: Unlike previous cases, the Supreme Court gave schools the right to limit student verbal speech by students when that speech is vulgar or disruptive to school function. This mainly applies to minors in school.
