

### They're, Their, and There

**They're=They are**

**Example:** They're going to the store.

**Their** shows ownership or possession.

**Example:** Kelly and Rick are rich; **their** house is very large. (In this case "their" signifies that Kelly and Rick own the house; it is their house.)

**There** is a place.

**Example:** The puppy is sitting over **there**. (In this case, "there" refers to the place where the puppy is sitting.)
