Sir,

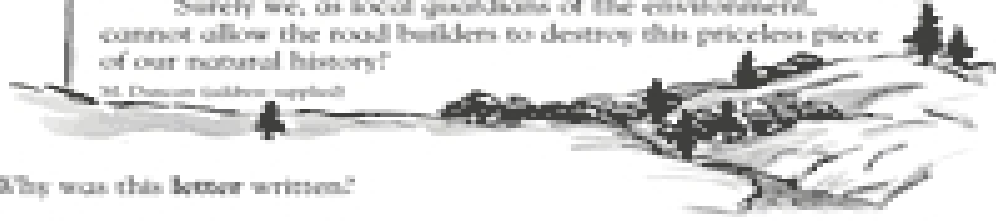
